

Chills and Fever

Alternating Chills and fever

- intermediate or Shao Yang Syndrome
- Bitter taste in mouth
- Stuffy feeling chest
- Nausea / Vomitin
- at intermediate level between exterior and interior organs

Tidle fever

- Fever that becomes worth at a certain time of day
- thin little or not coat, red tongue
- constipation
- afternoon - evening
- afternoon
- yin deficiency
- yang ming (ST, LI) excess

Fever with out Chills

- Aversion to heat
- persistent fever
- exterior heat invasion that enters interior
- profuse sweating
- severe thirst
- surging purse - large and rapid

Chills with out fever

- Interior cold usually yang deficiency
- deep slow week pulse

Chills Accompanied by Fever

- at same time
- usually wind-heat or wind-cold invasion
- exterior invasion and at exterior
- wind-cold
 - chills stronger
 - no sweating
 - aching / headache
 - superficial + tense/tight
 - pores closed do to cold
- wind-heat
 - chills mild, fever stronger
 - sweating
 - thirsty
 - superficial + rapid
 - pores open
- fever can be either true or just subjective heat
- chills are chattering chills or just subjective cold, ie. aversion to cold
